Dear WestFed Survey Community:

Wildfire ravaged the Western United States in the 2017 and 2018. Devastation impacted many, including some in the land surveying profession. Along with the terrible destruction came those that were willing to help. Lots of individuals reached into to their pockets to give to those in need, surveyors where no exception.

The NSPS Foundation established a disaster relief fund which has been a valuable resource to help support those in the survey community. Recent natural disasters across the Country have created a need for more private assistance. On May 18, 2018 the Western Federation of Professional Surveyors joined efforts with the NSPS Foundation and established the Western State Scholarship and Relief Fund. This fund will benefit from the NSPS Foundations assets and help grow the money faster to support those in need.

WFPS RELIEF FUND RULES & APPLICATION PROCEDURE

ABOUT THE RELIEF FUND

The WFPS Relief Fund was established by the WFPS Board of Directors and the National Society of Professional Surveyors Foundation, Inc. on May 16, 2018. The Relief Fund was established to provide assistance to those in the land surveying community that have been affected by natural disasters, or similar tragedy. WFPS and the NSPS Foundation entered into a memorandum of understanding defining the fund and its administration.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Applicants must be employed in or associated with the land surveying profession. The applicant must reside in the western 13 states that are members of the Western Federation of Professional Surveyors, Inc. (WFPS). Member states are: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

AMOUNT OF AWARD

The amount and number of awards will be determined on an annual basis by the WFPS Board of Directors.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Persons in need may apply by completing the WFPS Relief Fund application form available on the www.wfps.org web site. The application package must be postmarked no later than six months following the event:

- 1. Completed WFPS Relief Fund Application
- 2. Nomination from state surveying association.

Donations

Associations or individuals that wish to donate to the Relief Fund may send a check to WFPS, 526 South E Street, Santa Rosa, CA 95404. WFPS will send the donation to the NSPS Foundation and provide a receipt to the donor for any tax deduction benefit.

SELECTION

Applicants shall be ranked by the WFPS Relief Fund Committee based on their level of need. The rank order list shall be forwarded onto the WFPS Board of Directors for confirmation of the recipients and amount of award. Alternate recipients may be selected in the event that the selected recipients are unable to accept the award.

AWARD NOTIFICATION

The Relief Fund Committee Chair will send the recipients a notice of award specifying the terms of the award. The recipients shall return the award notice of award acknowledging the terms.

DISBURSEMENTS

WFPS will report the award to NSPS Foundation and request reimbursement for the amount of the award. From the available funds a check in the name of the recipient will be issued by WFPS.


Western Federation of Professional Surveyors Disaster Relief or Hardship Application

MIKE MICKIEWICZ/PAUL REID MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP RULES & APPLICATION PROCEDURE

ELIGIBLE STUDENTS

Applicants must be undergraduates who have successfully completed at least one year towards an associate degrees or two years of undergraduate study towards a four year program leading to a degree in the Land Surveying profession. Applicants must have the intention of taking the NCEES Fundamentals of Land Surveying exam.

ELIGIBLE INSTITUTIONS

Eligible institutions include any public or private, generally accredited colleges with a curriculum leading to a two or four year degree in land surveying. The college must be in the western 13 states that are members of the Western Federation of Professional Surveyors, Inc. (WFPS). Member states are: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIPS

The amount and number of scholarships will be determined on an annual basis by the WFPS Board of Directors.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Interested persons may apply by completing the WFPS application form available on the www.wfps.org web site. The application package must be postmarked by March 1st and must include:

- 1. Completed WFPS Scholarship Application
- 2. Transcript of all college work
- 3. A minimum of one letter of recommendation from a college professor or a past employer.
- 4. An essay specifying educational goals, career goals, and qualifications for scholarship:

SELECTION

Applicants shall be ranked by the WFPS Scholarship Committee based on their level of academic achievements, qualifications, other achievements, quality and presentation of their essay. The rank order list shall be forwarded onto the WFPS Board of Directors for confirmation of the recipients and amount of scholarship awarded. Alternate recipients may be selected in the event that the selected recipients are unable to accept the award.

AWARD NOTIFICATION

The Scholarship Committee Chairman will send the recipients a notice of award specifying the terms of the award. The recipients shall return the scholarship notice of award acknowledging the terms.

TIME PERIOD FOR ELIGIBILITY

The awards shall be for the period of one academic year. Students applying for the renewal of the scholarship will be considered on the same basis as first time applicants.

DISBURSEMENTS

Upon verification of registration for full-time enrollment each term, checks in the name of the recipient will be issued in substantially equal disbursements for each academic term/semester and sent to the recipient.

PUBLICITY

The Scholarship Committee may provide eligible institutions a notice of the WFPS scholarship program on an annual basis. When the recipient has accepted the scholarship, the committee can provide appropriate publicity to WFPS, state and local survey associations, and the academic institution. The recipients agree to allowing their names to be released by applying for this scholarship.
